

Archibald Woodard of Hebron

At the Surrogate Court held for the County of Washington at Granville in said County on the 4th March 1841. Present, J. C. Parker, Surrogate

In the matter of the estate of Archibald Woodard of Hebron in said County deceased. On reading and filing the petition of Daniel Woodard John Woodard and Hiram Case duly verified setting forth that the said deceased departed this life on or about the fifth day of February just past being an inhabitant of the town of Hebron in the County of Washington at the time of his death leaving no widow but leaving the following children him surviving to wit: Daniel Woodard, Benjamin Woodard, John Woodard, Samuel Woodard, Archibald Woodard, Polly Case wife of Hiram Case above named, Anna Kenyon wife of Tebulon Kenyon all of the County of Washington aforesaid and Sally Seaver wife of Symon H. Seaver of Wisconsin Territory town of Darsien & County of Walworth that the said deceased died intestate and left personal property in the whole not exceeding in value the sum of eight thousand dollars and praying that letters of administration my be granted them of the goods, chattels, and credits of said deceased according to law. It is therefore ordered that letters of administration of the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased be granted to the said Daniel Woodard, John Woodard, and Hiram Case on their taking the oath of office required by law and entering into a bond to the People of the State of New York with at least two sureties to be approved by the surrogate in the presence ? of Sixteenth thousand Dollars conditioned that they will faithfully execute the trust reposed in them as such and obey all the orders of the Surrogate of the said County touching the administration of said estate and bringing the said bond in this Court.
