The Woodards of Tarleton, Arkansas*

Isham D.³ Woodard [John², William¹] was born 1811 son of John Woodard and Elizabeth Blackwell, and married Rebecca Webb in North Carolina. Isham and Rebecca Woodard removed to Arkansas and are buried at Snowball. Their son, William M.⁴ Woodard, born 1828, married Cecilia Lillie Moore in North Carolina and they had two sons and three daughters. The second son, Ephraim⁵ Woodard [commonly called Eph], was born February 19, 1856 in North Carolina. After the death of his first wife, Cecilia, William M. Woodard married Susanna J. Barnes and moved to Arkansas with his family. Young Eph came to Arkansas working along with a wagon train heading to Texas. He later came back to Arkansas, settling at Calf Creek in Searcy County where his grandfather Isham Woodard was living. He soon moved on to Cave Creek in Newton County where he was a homesteader on the banks of Cave Creek.

Ephraim⁵ Woodard married Rosalie Dickey in 1878. They had one daughter, Nora, and two sons, Grant and Johnnie. The infant sons died young and are buried at McCutcheon Cemetery at Bass, near their mother Rosie who died in 1887. Eph married Martha Caterine Ketcherside on May 30, 1889. Martha was born near Iceledo, September 19, 1870, daughter of James Hosey and Mary (Brents) Ketcherside. She died April 16, 1943.

Eph and Martha Woodard lived on their farm near Cave Creek until 1904 when the creek flooded out their home and crops. They moved their family of girls and homesteaded the old Markey place near top of the Lurton mountain at Tarleton Flats. Their only son, Charlie, died as an infant and is buried at the McCutcheon Cemetery. Eight daughters, Nora, Minnie, Fannie, Dullie, Nellie, Iva, Ethel, and Dorothy, were raised on the Lurton farm.

N[orth] Newton County roads in those days were not easy to travel. The main road followed the route of the "Old Cheatham Turnpike" built in 1850. It wound roughly along the course of later Highways 123 and 7,

wide enough for a wagon with iron wheels to travel with most of the larger rocks moved, from Mt. Judea past Lurton, down the mountain through Dover to Russellville; named for Barnett Cheatham, an early settler of Mt. Judea, who surveyed and built the trail. Before the Cheatham Road was built parts of the route were called old Jefferson Highway. In 1925, the State built a gravel road along the same path. They called it Highway 123 from Mt. Judea to highway 7 past the old Woodard farm. Ephs' children did not live to see this completed, but his grandchildren will.

The Woodard pond furnished water for each road project through Lurton from 1925 through today. Now covering ten acres, it's springs continue to run down the mountain one way into Cave Creek then Buffalo, then finally to Mississippi which passes my home in New Orleans every day.

Old Number Seven was rough, with big rocks and hairpin curves. Grandpa Eph Woodard went down the mountain to Russellville with his team and wagon every few months, a trip of two days each way, resting at night with a family along the way who fed him and his team of mules and gave him a place to sleep at night, hauling a load of corn, hay, apples, or whatever he raised that season to sell in Russellville. Eph stayed at the Wagon Yard in Russellville, located near the railroad depot, covering a large section of streets. Most comforts of home were stalls for mules, parking for wagons,

stoves to cook on and bunks to rent for the night.

He sold his produce and bought supplies for a few months on the mountain. Staple foods purchased were 100 pounds of sugar, 100 pounds of flour, 20 pounds of coffee beans, ten pounds of salt, baking soda, cocoa, and some stick candy for the little ones. Bringing home t[h]read and a bolt of cloth to make dresses for the eight Woodard girls (some teens, some babies), who all made a dress from the same bolt of calico cloth. The calico in 1906 was red and baby Iva's red calico dress has survived 90 years in family treasure boxes.

School age Woodard girls walked two miles to school at Tarleton in the "Board Shanty" school (so called because of boards nailed across cracks in the logs to keep out the wind) held three months at a time, to eighth grade. In May, 1995, Dorothy told us her father blazed trees with his axe so they could walk to school through the woods in the snow without losing their way. In 1918, the Woodard family moved to the present location of the Woodard farm, near the forks of the Bass road and Highway 123 so the little girls would be closer to school. Tarleton school ended with the schoolhouse blowing away in the tornado of 1926. The Woodard girls had finished eighth grade by

this time and some were married.

Around 1920, Eph bought 250 acres of flat land next to Woodard Pond and put in a gristmill to grind corn. My 84 year old aunty, Dorothy Woodard, told my sisters how skilled Grandpa Eph was in grinding corn for people, weighing it carefully in his hand, knowing how coarse to grind. Next to the gristmill, they built a sawmill to make lumber from virgin timber to build their new house and outbuildings. Ed Rosamond fired the boiler for steam to run the mills for his father-in-law. Most buildings were in constant use until recent times. Now, in 1995, only the "little house by the pond" is left in use by the family.

Iva went to Jasper to work for the Murray Hotel and Ethel was ready to go to high school at Parthenon Baptist boarding School. They went to a "play party" at the Lurton home of I.C. Sutton when Andrew Sutton, I.C.'s brother, came to visit from Zion, Illinois. He made several trips to Lurton to see Ethel Woodard. Ethel and Andrew Sutton married in 1925. Of the eight Woodard girls, only Dullie, Nellie and my mother Iva stayed on the mountain to raise their families.

The oldest daughter, Nora Woodard, married a McGlasson and had children, Arlie, Flora and John. She later married George Hopkins and their children were Bob, Willard, Early, Oral, Clarence, Wilburn and Ethel. They lived near Fort Smith and Guthrie, Oklahoma.

Minnie Woodard (1892-1968) married William Jackson Freeman [called "Will"] born 1888 in the Big Lick Community on Indian Creek in Pope County. They married [in] 1908 and their children are Truman (who died July 1995), Lloyd, Grace, Erta, Noram and J.H.

Frances (1895-1958) who was called Fannie married C.T. Taylor. Their children Doyle, Doyne and Iva Louise are all deceased. The Taylors had a cafe and grocery business and lived in Guthrie, Oklahoma.

Myrtle Dulcinea Woodard (1897-1985), called Dullie, married Ed Rosamond, son of Rosa and Nonimus Rosamond. Their children were Vernon, Floye, Edna, Gladys Mae, Wynonia, Rose, Shirley, and Edward Jr. Gladys died as a young child and Edna passed away in the 1980s. The others live in Oklahoma except Vernon who makes his home near Lurton.

Nellie Luvadie Woodard (1899-1993) married George Daniels of Lurton. Their son Ernest lived his early life on the Woodard farm with his grandparents Ephraim and Martha Woodard. After their death, Ernest purchased the Woodard farm and raised his family there. He died in

1991. His children Richard, Wayne, and Betty own the farm today. The Woodard cousins continue to call this home and gather there for Woodard reunions.

Iva Lufloy Woodard (1906-1951 married Errol Haynes and their children are Colleen (born in log house at Tarleton in 1928), Phyllis, Patsy, and twins Carrol and Errol. Iva (Woodward) and Errol Haynes are buried in Tarleton Cemetery.

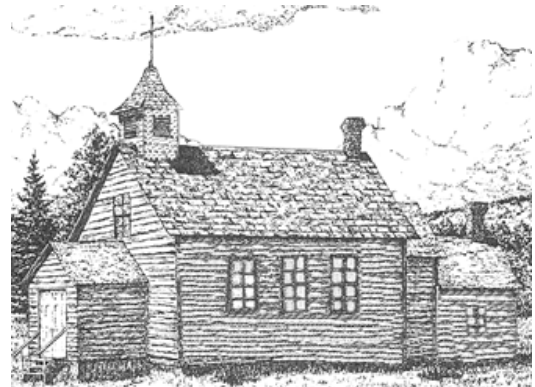
Ethel Woodard (1908-1992) married, first, Andrew Sutton. The couple lived in Zion, Illinois and had one son, James who died in 1951. Ethel married, second, Otto Anderson and they resided at Gravette, Arkansas.

Dorothy Woodard (1910-1995) married Coleman Haynes and had children Lloyd, who died in 1994, and Jack who lives with his family in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Dorothy and her husband are buried at Fayetteville.

Most Woodard cousins now live away from Newton County. Many have died and those of us left travel once each year for a Woodard-Ketcherside family reunion at Earnest Daniels Memorial Park on the banks of the lake we call the "Old Woodard Pond," on the weekend of Decoration Day at Tarleton Community Cemetery.

We are proud of the legacy we share—being lucky enough to have been born and raised in Newton County on top of the mountain at Tarleton Flats near Lurton. At the time of his death in 1945, Ephraim and Martha Woodard had 58 grandchildren. Descendants now number in the hundreds and live all over the world. A surprising amount of genetic mountain qualities continue to be passed on to our little ones.

McAdams, all of Baton Rouge; five grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by husband, James Herbert Woodward. Tidbits—Some Virginia Sources

Janice Woodward Calloway* brings to our attention a new book which will be of interest to readers with Virginia ancestry. *Virginia in 1760: A Reconstructed Census* (Miami Beach, Fla.: T.L.C. Genealogy, 1996), "which is based on deeds, wills, tax lists, order books, etc. ... This is an alphabetical list of Virginia inhabitants, their county of residence, and the source of the information about them." Eighty-eight different references are cited, many of which are available from American Genealogical Lending Library (593 West 100 North, P.O. Box 329, Bountiful, UT 84011-0329), and The Library of Virginia (11th Street at Capitol Square, Richmond, VA 23219-3491), and were used to compile the entries. While some of the entries were obtained from previously published abstracts, others appear to have been obtained from microfilm of original records.

Virginia in 1760 cites the following Woodard and Woodward surnames: Benjamin, Prince George; Henry, Norfolk; Joel, Norfolk; John, Goochland; Joshua, Norfolk; Oliver, Southampton; Randolph, Bedford; Richard, Bedford; Thomas, Isle of Wight; and William, Nansemond.

Early Settlers of Lee County, Virginia, and Adjacent Counties compiled by Hattie Byrd Muncy Bales (Greensboro, N.C.: Media, Inc., 1977) was called to our attention by Jean Deal*. Volume two contains a details on descendants of Captain Henry Woodward (pages 492-496) "who settled on Sugar Run in Lee County where many of them lived and died." Henry Woodward (apparently married twice) married, first, Sarah Sheiton (Shelton). Henry died about 1800 in Stafford County. Some of Henry's sons removed from Stafford to Lee County, Virginia, and some of Henry's descendants were later removed to Indiana and Illinois.
